### Co-ops make a difference:

- Since 1935 electric cooperatives have been making a difference across America.
- There are more than 900 co-ops serving more than 40 million people in 47 states – 12% of the nation’s population.
- Electric co-ops own and maintain 2.5 million miles (42%) of the nation’s electric distribution lines.
- Electric co-ops deliver 10% of the total kilowatt hours sold in the U.S. each year.
- Electric co-ops employ 67,000 people in the U.S.

Members of electric cooperatives are the owners and express higher than average levels of customer satisfaction. Co-ops put their member-owners first. In addition, co-ops are locally owned and operated. When members call the co-op, they are talking with their friends and neighbors.

South Carolina has 20 cooperatives that deliver power directly to consumers.

The R. D. Bennett Scholarship is a one-time check in the amount of \$2,500 issued to a student and the college, university, trade or tech school of the student's choice by the state association of electric cooperatives.



The scholarship winner is chosen based on an essay, an application, and the amount of interest and participation shown on the tour.

## National Youth Leadership Council

The winner will travel for free back to Washington, D.C. in July for a leadership conference, and then to the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association meeting. Selection is based on an application, a speech and a vote by fellow students.
